Two homes to be dedicated

Habitat for Humanity of Kenosha has announced the upcoming dedication of two more homes.

The homes being dedicated in the coming days on 35th Avenue will mark the 20th and 21st homes the local nonprofit has built for the community.

A home dedication ceremony will be held for Amanda Marin and her family on Oct. 25 at their new home in the 4700 block of 35th Avenue. The following week, a ceremony will be held on Oct.

29 for another woman and her family in the same neighborhood.

Since 2012, Habitat for Humanity has been contributing to the growth of the community through their mission: everyone deserves a place to call home.

Marin, the 20th homeowner and mother of two, in a prepared statement highlighted the importance of a home as “a place my kids can always come back to. No matter what happens I will always have this place for them.”

Her favorite part of the Habitat process, she said, was “that we can be physically part of the process of building our home... seeing how much goes into the process of starting from the group up makes me appreciate this opportunity so much more.”

Habitat for Humanity funded the build through local donations and funds granted through the City of Kenosha. Habitat for Humanity of Kenosha is the mortgage lender, allowing an affordable mortgage for people in need.
